... Delivering high quality, effective and safe prescribing interventions within a substance use service

WHAT I AM ACCOUNTABLE FOR:

- Developing strength-based, safe prescribing plans for substance use treatment;
- Being accountable for own prescribing practice and seeking advice when outside of competency/knowledge;
- Ensuring medicine optimisation and cost effectiveness of prescribing practice;
- Ensuring the safe assessment and management of medically assisted community alcohol detoxes in line with policy;
- Contributing to accurate, person-centered and individualised risk assessments and risk management plans that safeguard service users, staff and others;
- Ensuring that prescribing plans are reviewed with the service user and Recovery Worker in line with organisational policy;
- Taking swift action in response to changes in service user's circumstances to proactively support engagement/reengagement with prescribing;
- Delivery of specific clinical procedures and tasks within my level of training and competency;
- Contributing to and where appropriate, chairing, multidisciplinary team meetings/complex case reviews;
- Supporting the training and continuous professional development of colleagues within my service;
- Targeting clinical and harm reduction interventions to support in the achievement of clinical key performance indicators;
- Build relationships with the LPC including ensuring effective relationships with pharmacy providers
- Medicine optimisation for the service including ensuring most cost effective pharmacological interventions
- Taking responsibility for your own continuous professional development;
- Actively engaging in clinical supervision processes to GREEN support learning and development.

PEOPLE

- Delivering person-centered clinical and prescribing interventions with compassion and care for the people we support;
- Delivering high quality, safe and effective clinical and prescribing interventions within my competency and training which deliver excellent standards of care;
- Working collaboratively with service users to understand and meet their needs;
- Working as part of a multi-disciplinary team with colleagues including providing cover for planned and unplanned absences;
- Contributing to, and where appropriate, chairing, multi-disciplinary team meetings/complex case reviews;
- Supporting the training, learning and practice of operational and clinical staff within the service;
- To provide a mentorship/assessorrole for students;
- Provide mentoring/coaching/supervision of other clinical staff within the service;
- Effective communication, including written and verbal (establishing rapport, listening, managing challenging situations, communicating confidently);
- Developing therapeutic alliances and effective partnerships to support recovery journeys, offering health promotion and harm reduction advice and screening alongside other clinical and psychosocial interventions;
- Ensure the effective flow of information internally and externally by passing on and seeking information required;
- Ensuring written communication with GP takes place following clinical appointments;
- Actively engaging in your own supervision, Ongoing Personal Review, Personal Development Planning and Continuous Professional Development;
- Ensuring an environment free from discrimination;
- Prioritising safeguarding of children and vulnerable adults and escalating any concerns.

PROCESS

- Responsibility for the clinical management and substitute prescribing (Opiate Substitute Therapy) of a caseload of service users including specialist assessment, collaborative care planning, risk management, review and evaluation;
- Developing strength-based, safe prescribing plans for substance use treatment that are; comprehensive, person-centered and individualised based on a clear assessment of the service user's needs and circumstances;
- Utilising psychosocial interventions (1:2:1 and group);
- Decision making and management of supervised consumption/pick up frequency taking into consideration clinical safety and cost effectiveness;
- Assessing for, prescribing and overseeing the safe management of medically assisted community alcohol detoxifications;
- Supporting with assessment for inpatient detoxification and residential rehabilitation;
- Adhering to titration procedures to safely initiate substitute prescribing;
- Accessing Summary Care Records in line with policy;
- Undertake phlebotomy and dry blood spot testing to undertake routine screening and testing, ensuring adherence to identified pathway including follow up;
- Report all incidents using datix to support learning;
- Support in analysis of incident trends and in service user mortality review processes;
- Completion of clinical audits including supporting with medicine optimisation and cost effectiveness;
- Use of insight data to target clinical and harm reduction interventions to ensure achievement of clinical key performance indicators;
- High quality record keeping for service users in treatment;
- Follow all information governance guidance and policies;
- Maintain confidentiality as outlined within data protection policies;
- Ensure all practice is in line with Turning Point policy and NICE guidance.
